

START OF THE ASYCUDA TRANSIT ON THE SECOND TRANSIT AXIS: ISLAM QALA – HEART - KABUL

(18 November 2006)

The ASYCUDA Transit System was started on the 2nd transit axis, i.e. Islam Qala Customs Office (border with Iran) → Herat Customs House → Kabul Customs House, on 18 November 2006.

All the goods in transit are now registered in ASYCUDA in Islam Qala Customs Office at the border and are subsequently cleared by the Customs Houses in Heart and Kabul. All the old documents used in Customs (e.g. ElmoKabar, Teket Tashrih, Maktoob Traffic etc) have been abolished by the implementation of internationally standardised customs documents.

The imported vehicles are also registered in ASYCUDA and are subsequently registered by the Traffic Police Department on the basis of the ASYCUDA T1 registration number only. Now, the consignees can go to register their vehicles with the Traffic Police Department in the same day (of the registration of ASYCUDA T1 at the border). This means a significant reduction of the time needed to register an imported vehicle, which before was up to 3 months.
